Assam Bulldozer Victims

- In Nalbari, Dhubri, and Goalpara, a large number of houses belonging to the Muslim minority were demolished by bulldozers, leaving thousands of people homeless.
- Over ₹50 lakh in relief distributed for shelters among displaced families in Nalbari, Dhubri, and Goalpara.
- A delegation led by the General Secretary visited the affected areas (15–16 July 2025), and the Jamiat President himself visited on September 1, 2025, assuring both legal and humanitarian support.

- We are the second largest community in this country, yet one concern is repeatedly raised: despite many efforts, the real impact often does not reach the grassroots level. Whether programs are initiated by organizations, community institutions, or even governments, their benefits frequently fail to reach the people who need them most.
- Recognizing this gap, Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind decided that real change must begin from the village and neighborhood level. With this vision, the concepts of the “Model Village” were introduced — a multidimensional approach to community development rooted at the grassroots.
- The objective is simple yet transformative: to reach every household, connect directly with people, and cultivate a spirit of service among the youth. Young people who already possess passion and commitment are identified, trained, and empowered as “Village Champions” so they can become agent of positive change in their own communities.
- Alhamdulillah, this initiative has been running continuously for the last three to four years, and today nearly 100 villages across two states are benefiting from this model. But this is only the beginning. The need of the hour is to expand and multiply this work so that meaningful development can reach many more areas.

- Launched a nationwide voter awareness campaign.

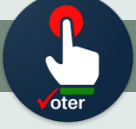


Aim

- ◆ Working together to **protect the environment** like planting trees, careful use of water and cleaning the area.

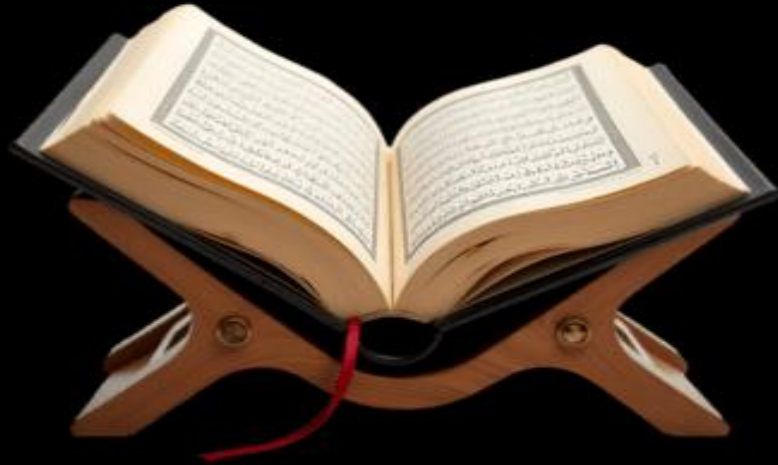


Social Reform Department

Reform Committees are formed at the neighborhood, mosque, and community levels to promote community engagement. Their activities include Friday awareness addresses, Qur'an Education sessions, women's and youth meetings, community reform programs, individual counseling, campaigns against social evils, religious and educational awareness initiatives, and an annual ten-day outreach program.

Since its inception, Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind has been engaged in the work of social reform. However, in 1991, this department was formally established. Alhamdulillah, the department functions under the supervision of a Central Committee and actively works toward the implementation of various social reform programs.

Jamiat Children Village

- After the 2001 Anjar earthquake, which claimed 465 schoolchildren's lives, Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind established Jamiat Children Village on 5.25 hectares to house and educate orphans from the earthquake and the 2002 Gujarat pogrom.

Spacious dormitories accommodate groups of 10 children, each under the care of an "ammi" (mother) to provide a family-like atmosphere.

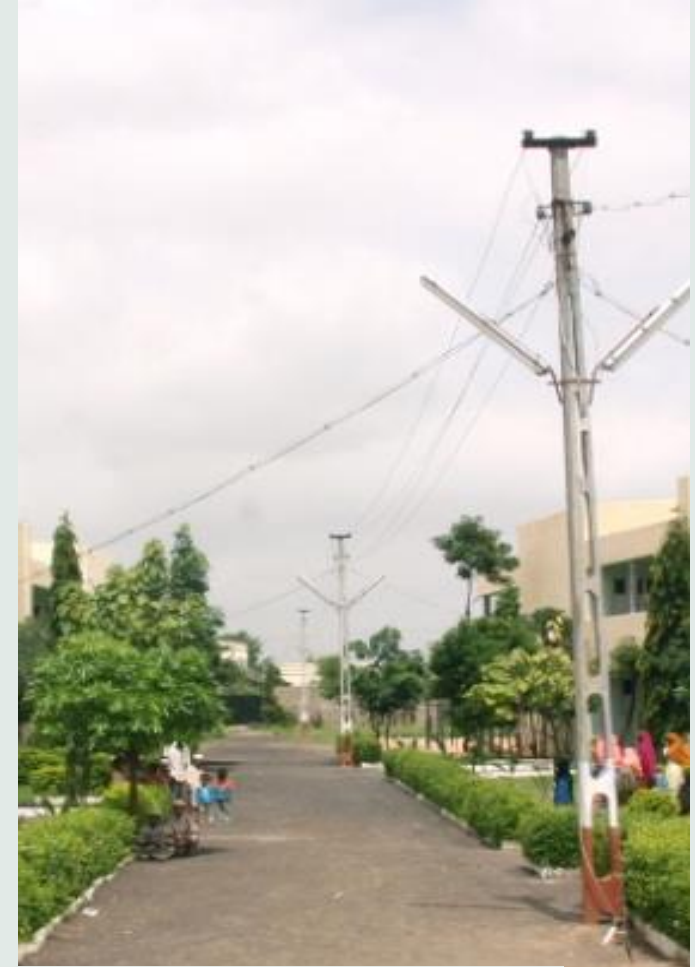
